First Reading: Sirach 27:4-7

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:54-58

Paul speaks of the mystery of transformation that is victory over death when our mortality puts on immortality. We are encouraged by Paul to be steadfast and immovable, filling our lives with the work of the Lord.

Gospel: Luke 6:39-45

Today, Jesus teaches through the use of parables, first encouraging us to be like the teacher, understand that the blind cannot lead the blind. If we hear God's word, our foundation will be strong, unshaken, steadfast, built upon rock.

EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Jesus told his disciples a parable. 'Can a blind person guide a blind person? Will not both fall into a pit?... Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own?... You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first, then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye."

What a wonderful teaching as we prepare for the beginning of Lent. Spend a moment to see the need for self correction, before judging, criticizing and damaging the reputation of someone else.

Lent is the time for my spiritual renewal, my search for holiness, my need for personal reform, before I look for the splinter in another's eye.

I look at my home, my family and ask how can I make this Lent a rewarding experience, not only in my own personal practice, but also with my spouse, with my children and those who are closest to me? Miracles can happen, but first, check out the wooden beam, 'then you will see clearly', and then move in the right direction. The pit surrounding us is real, known as the devil, and our coming Lent is the remedy to resist evil. Devil without the 'd' is...
