In theory, we should be working on our conversion every day of our lives, but we so easily become busy that we can lose perspective. It is not that we are bad people. We might not even be doing things that are all that bad. But we might have let God drift to the edge of our lives.

This is why we need penitential seasons like Advent and Lent. They give us special times during which we can evaluate our lives and recommit ourselves to a gospel lifestyle. Spiritual reading, regular examinations of conscience, the Sacrament of Reconciliation, etc., can all help us to be that which we would like to be.

This is why it is essential not to allow our material preparations for the celebration of Christmas to become so important that they block our spiritual preparations.



SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

In this beautiful passage, a messianic prophecy, Isaiah exults in the coming of the Lord, who will bring justice and peace for all.

Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9

Paul reveals to us the necessity of living in peace and harmony. His words "Accept one another, then, as Christ accepted you, for the Glory of God" are as needed today as they were in Paul's own time.

Gospel: Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptizer prepares the way for Jesus. Clothed in a garment of camel's hair, he baptizes the people in the Jordan River, but warns the Pharisees in ringing tones that they must give evidence that they mean to reform.


