

## SHARING OUR TREASURE

Public dispute is the last resort, not the first. The first step is very discrete-only the two parties involved speak. If the situation is resolved there, then the whole thing ends. As we prepare to offer correction to someone, we should ask ourselves: "what if the first step is successful? What if no one else on earth finds out that I have corrected that person? Will I still be happy?" This is really the correction that we should desire the mostthe kind where the situation is resolved quickly and quietly. We do not correct because we want to look good, but because we love the other person. This is the difference between a work of mercy and mere grandstanding.
