THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Paul reminds the Thessalonians to constantly ready themselves for Christ's arrival. He tells them to "avoid any semblance of evil" so that they may be found irreproachable when Jesus does arrive.

Gospel: John 1:6-8, 19-28

John explains that he is only a messenger to the people for one more powerful than himself. John stresses to them that they must make a path for the one so powerful that he is not fit to unfasten the strap of his sandal.

START OF THE CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION

Our Lincoln Park PAL Soccer team started off the Christmas Season with a celebration in Halloran Hall. A good time was had by all.









Deacon Vincent Patrick Ricciardi, Sr. was born on St. Patrick's Day in 1949, to Josephine (Filingeri) and Federico Ricciardi of Newark, NJ. He has two brothers. Vincent married Daisy Duarte Munoz on February 1, 1969, and celebrated their 54 anniversary this year. Daisy was born in New York City and raised in Connecticut, Newark and Irvington, NJ. Daisy serves as the Land Use Administrators Assistant in Millstone, NJ. Vincent and Daisy have three sons, all married. Vincent, Jr. (Chief of Hillside Police) and his wife Alexia have three children, Nicolas Vincent 27, Trianna Nicole 23, and Sofia Carmen 16-year-old. Marc (Retired Chief Sparta Fire Department and business owner) and his wife Amy have a 23-year-old daughter, Lauren Ann and 15-year-old Max and Leo 13-year-old. Peter (Officer Boonton Twp. Police Department) and his wife Erin Four children, Juliana Lee 21 and Cyaden Anthony 17 years old and Dante 14 and Julian 12 years old.

After 27 years with the Essex County Department of Public Safety (Acting Captain), Deacon Vincent retired. But his involvement in various activities shows that he is not retired, just working for the Lord in a different capacity. Deacon Vincent began healing ministry in 2000 at Saint John's Lakehurst and attended training at St. Veronica's. He had already applied to the diaconate and after his first year of a two-year program of healing ministry, was received into the Trenton Diocese Diaconate Program. He and Daisy were devastated when, after completing his first year in the program, Daisy was found to have breast cancer. Vincent asked Daisy if she wanted him to drop out of Diaconate and Healing ministry training and she told him, "No way." They had been waiting for this second opportunity since 1991, when Deacon Vincent left the Paterson Diocese program because there were too many things going on in their lives at that time, and he was not able to complete the journey. Little did he know when he entered the healing ministry how the ministry would come to serve his wife. She developed a severe reaction to chemotherapy for her breast cancer and went into shock. A team from Divine Mercy Prayer Group went to the hospital and prayed with him for her survival. God answered their prayers and reinforced His calling of Vincent to serve. Vincent says that with the grace of God and all the prayers, Daisy is doing fine after 23 years, and he was able to complete the program. Daisy has joined him in this wonderful ministry.

Having been blessed with many gifts, Deacon Vince is very much involved in Divine Mercy Healing Prayer Ministry, spreading the Word, and working with the very young, as well as the older members of our faith, he visits those in the hospital, and he and his friends pick up bread from Atlanta Bread Company and Panera's for the homeless and needy each evening. As a part of the healing prayer team, he realizes that when they are called in, the need is great and at times death is imminent. Vincent proclaims that God is Great because of the many healings that have occurred, and his wife is living proof of the healing powers of Jesus. Yes, Vince admits, they have lost some, but the ministry makes the suffering individual's journey home to the Father that much easier. He has seen the miracles of Divine Mercy, and he has dedicated his life to the spreading of Divine Mercy Devotion. Deacon Vince was appointed the Director of Divine Mercy New Jersey and has taken the task of having 80 more Prayer Cenacles in 2000. As a member of The Eucharistic Apostles of The Divine Mercy. Deacon Vince believes there is so much comfort in prayer and when the team gets together, they are aware that God is with them and that His Holy spirit is upon each of them. Vince is the leader of the Divine Mercy Healing Prayer Team and was the Deacon of The Eucharist at this Divine Mercy Sunday in Stockbridge Mass 2009 & 2011. Vince is also a member of the Association of Marian Helpers and is actively involved in raising funds for new vestments and repairs to the entrance of the Nation Shrine. Deacon Vince is also a strong believer in Padre Pio and visited San Giovanni Rotunda, Italy and the Shrine of Saint Gerard for those with problem pregnancies (3/14/09). Each year Deacon Vince goes to San Pedro, Belize, and ministers for a week or two to those who have little to nothing. Remembering to be humble for all he has been given by God.

Deacon Vincent is the Spiritual Director for Maki.US Polish Children's Dance Troupe and a Founding member of The Polish Language Academy of Manchester NJ.

Deacon Vince has been given the following gifts by God; Prophecy Basically, a prophet had the ability to receive direct revelation from God and then to communicate that revelation to men. Connected with the gift of prophecy is direct guidance from God. Healing The main purpose of the gift of healing, just as the gift of miracles, was to validate God's message. Each time the gift of healing was administered, it was done in connection with one of the apostles. Gift of Discerning Spirits Since wisdom relates to discernment in the revelation of God's Word, it must be classified as temporary. Some limit wisdom to applying Bible truths to the specific needs of others, and as such, classify it as permanent. It is preferred to classify the gift of wisdom as a temporary gift as there appears to be more evidence that the wisdom was directly related to the revealing of God's Word in laying the foundation of the Bible. Word of Knowledge The gift of word of knowledge was a temporary gift to establish the truth of God and mankind. This was accomplished with the New Testament. The word of knowledge was a special supernatural knowledge, not the knowledge that comes because of studying the Bible. During Healing Deacon Vince Boast in the Lord only that he is but an instrument of God doing the will of God. All healings come from God and God only. He further states that he is truly Honored by the trust of God though he claims to be unworthy of such beautiful gifts of God. A turning point in Vincent's life began on May 28, 1968, on hill 100A in North Viet Nam. It was the day he became a casualty. It took over six hours to get a helicopter to his squad's location, and Vincent was finally evacuated to a field hospital where a young triage doctor pronounced there was nothing he could do for Vincent. Hearing that, Vincent yelled, "You can't let me die." The Surgeon General of the field hospital heard him too and asked his age. Vincent replied he had just turned 18. The Surgeon General and his staff operated on him for over 23 hours. Vincent had an out of body experience and knew he was being called for some reason. But he wasn't sure what that was at the time. After discharge, he returned to New Jersey where he met and married Daisy some seven months later. Vincent believes God called him to become one of the first ministers of the Eucharist, a scout leader, a member of the parish council, and a youth leader. But still Vincent was not sure if this was his calling. He remembers being there when the late Pope John Paul II came to New York. He happened to be standing right over where the Pope walked out and as the Pope looked around and up, he looked at Vincent and then Vincent knew God had a plan for him. He tried to answer the call; however, he believed he had been looking too hard and for some reason he fell away from the Church for about 9 years. When he returned, the plan started appearing. He served the Church in any way he was asked. He became President of the Holy Name Society and became a Knight of Columbus which led him to a Board of Directors of Several Sources Shelter for unwed mothers. He remains a strong advocate for the unborn.

January 2006 Deacon Vince became a Knight Of The Immaculate
In October 15,2020 Deacon Vince became a member of The Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.

Deacon has traveled with the Healing ministry to the Philippines, Trinidad Tobago, San Pedro Belize, San Jose Costa Rica, Puerto Rico, New Mexico, Spain, Portugal, Italy, Poland, Canada, Israel, Belize, McAllen Texas, Atlanta Georgia, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, Corium NY, Kingston NY, Fort Bragg, NC, Fort Dix and Lakehurst Bases NJ, Tampa, Fl., Malibu, California, Brooklyn NY, Guam Tripler Army Hospital Hi. and throughout the State of New Jersey.
