Our Gospel is a continuation of the account of Jesus' first day in Capernaum. As we saw last week, this material was probably given to Saint Mark by Saint Peter, who was an eyewitness to these events.

We hear about the healing of Peter's mother-in-law. What is very interesting about this particular account is that she is one of the few people who receives a miracle in this Gospel and responds in an appropriate manner. Instead of drawing attention to herself, she responds to Jesus' gracious action by service.

When Jesus healed many in the village, he refused to allow the demons to speak because they knew him. They would have proclaimed that Jesus was the Messiah, and Jesus knew that the crowd would have misunderstood his role.

He did not intend to be seen as a political leader or a miracle worker. He was there to heal hearts and to call people to conversion. He was not the Messiah whom they wanted, but rather he was the Messiah whom they needed.

This is why, after he had prayed in a deserted spot for a while, he goes to the other villages in the area to proclaim the Word of God.
