The Samaritan woman in this story represents the Samaritans and the pagans. When Jesus begins to speak to the Samaritan woman at the well, she is hesitant. Jesus treats her with great dignity and respect – one could say with more respect than she treats herself.

Jesus offers her "living water". He promises that this water will become a font overflowing within her. This means that she will be filled to overflowing with God's grace and life.

The woman leaves her water jar, for, as Jesus promised, his grace has become a font of living water inside of her. She proclaims her message to the people from her village. Before she avoided them (going to the well at noon to avoid speaking to them); now she shares her discovery with them and she helps to bring them to salvation.

This is a powerful story of conversion. A woman who previously had been filled with fear was now filled to overflowing with love. It is also a story of people who search for love in many gods whom they worship (work, possessions, power, etc.) but had not found true love or peace. Like the Samaritan woman, we are called to leave those things that cannot bring us true peace.
