Jesus speaks of *agápe*, a love that requires total commitment and trust. It is the kind of love with which God loves us, a love that should be the model of the love we have for others. This love should be more than just a warm feeling toward others; it should be a compassionate gift of ourselves to meet the spiritual and bodily needs of our brothers and sisters. *Agápe* implies a reaching out to others in a caring attitude for their wellbeing without expecting any favor in return.

It is strong, positive, difficult, determined action. Jesus repeats the command to love one another three times, first explaining what it is ("*a new commandment*"), how it is to be applied ("*as I have loved you*"), and finally noting that this love would stand as *the trademark* of his disciples. Not only is this a new commandment, but also, Jesus teaches, it is the greatest.

Jesus loved by serving others, by helping them and by healing others. His was a love that healed and built up, that challenged and inspired people. It was a deeply forgiving and sacrificial love. "*No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends*".
