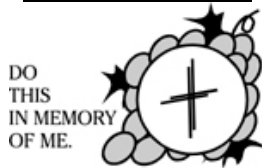

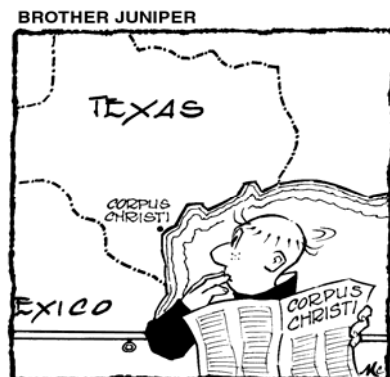

It was not enough that Jesus multiplied the food so that there would be more than enough for everyone to eat. Someone then had to distribute the bread and fish to the thousands of people in attendance. The disciples are the Church, as are we. To overlook their role, our role, in feeding the hungry with what at first seemed like an inadequate amount of food would be a mistake. We are essential agents in feeding the hungry. The disciples carried out Jesus' ministry by distributing their baskets of food. So can we.

Through Jesus, God provides us with an abundance of food – more than is necessary to sustain us. The twelve baskets of fragments are for the twelve tribes of Israel. No one in Israel would be hungry (physically or spiritually). Whether physical food as in the Gospel or spiritual food such as Christ's Body and Blood, an encounter with Jesus leaves us personally satisfied with an excess to share.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

GRADES K-8

Registration forms for the 2018-2019 CCD school year were sent out via email and are due back by **AUGUST 1st**. First Holy Communion – Children are required to complete 1st grade of Religious Education before they can enter into the 2nd grade of our program for First Holy Communion.

Registration for **new** students will also be taking place. Our program begins with Kindergarten and continues through Grade 8. If you have a child in **Kindergarten only**, the registration fee is \$30. **A copy of their baptismal certificate is required for each new child registered. Families must be registered members of the parish when registering for the program.**
