GRADES K-8

Registration forms for the 2017-2018 CCD school year are due back AUGUST 1ST. If you did not receive it or if your email address has changed since last year's registration (which would have been last summer), please be sure to email us at stjoelp@optonline.net with your new email address. Registration forms are available on the back tables in church and in our Parish Center.

First Holy Communion – Children are required to complete 1st grade of Religious Education before they can enter into the 2nd grade of our program for First Holy Communion.

Registration for **new** students will also be taking place. Our program begins with Kindergarten and continues through Grade 8. If you have a child in **Kindergarten only**, the registration fee is \$30. **A copy of their baptismal certificate is required for each new child registered. Families must be registered members of the parish when registering for the program.**

ATTENTION: 8TH GRADE PARENTS

As your child enters freshmen year, they will begin their preparation for Confirmation and enter the High School program. ***This program is separate from the K – 8.*** Therefore, during this summer you will receive a different registration form from Ken & Jen Shirkey, our Youth Ministers. They are the coordinators of the Confirmation Program.

KINDERGARTEN CLASSES

Our Religious Education program includes a Kindergarten class at 9 AM or 11 AM on Sundays. These classes focus on life, creation, Mary and Jesus and the Church. Formal prayer (Sign of the Cross and the Hail Mary) and informal prayer are also part of the experience. To be part of this program, come in to register or call and we will mail out a registration form. **All new registrants must be registered parishioners and are required to provide a baptismal certificate, if the baptism did not occur here at SJP.**

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

If you are planning to have your child baptized, you should be aware of the following regulations:

Unless you receive prior permission, the child is to be baptized in your parish, which is the parish in which you are registered or where you live. All Catholics in the United States belong to a full territorial parish by virtue of their address.

You have to make a pledge to raise the child in the faith. If there is sufficient doubt in the priest's mind that the parents will not raise the child in the faith, he can refuse to do the baptism.

According to the new Code of Canon Law, the sponsors for the child must both be baptized and one must be a practicing Roman Catholic. The new Code of Canon Law also insists that the Roman Catholic sponsor must have received both the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation.

Requests for a baptismal date should be made two months in advance. Parents having their first child baptized must participate in a preparation program.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

If you are planning to be married, you should be aware of the following regulations:

The diocese requires one year's notification to the parish before your marriage. If two Catholics are getting married, the marriage may take place in the parish of the bride or the groom. If they are getting married in another parish, they need a letter of permission from their own parish.

If a Catholic marries a non-Catholic and they wish to marry in a ceremony other than that of the Roman Catholic Church, this is possible but requires permission of the Church. All other regulations must be met. A non-Catholic minister can be part of a Catholic ceremony.

Pre-Cana is required before marriage. If either party has been married before, whether Catholic or not, an impediment exists which must be removed by the Church's Tribunal before they can remarry.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

BLOOD DRIVE

Holy Spirit School will be hosting a blood drive on Sunday, July 15th between 9 AM and 1 PM. The Mobile Community Blood service will be located outside of Holy Spirit Church in Pequannock between the church and school parking lot. All donors will receive the following health screenings: Cholesterol, Blood Pressure, Pulse, Iron and Blood Type. Donors must be at least 16 years of age (between 16 and 17 years – you will need signed parental consent forms and proof of age), be at least 110 pounds and in good health. You are required to present a picture ID, and you must eat a good meal and drink plenty of fluids before donating. **A single blood donation can save up to three lives.** The person in need of a blood transfusion may be a cancer patient, an organ transplant recipient, an accident victim, or even just an elderly person with anemia. A blood donation can take less than one hour and do a world of good for our friends and family members. You may set up an appointment in advance by calling or texting the coordinator, Linda Fischer, at 862.228.3430. However, walk-ins are always welcome and there is rarely any wait time.
