SHARING OUR TREASURE

Due to vacation, the July 22nd collection will be posted in next week's bulletin.

There is a boy who brings Jesus five barley loaves and two fish. Barley is the food of the poor, so this is probably all that the boy possessed. He gives it all to Jesus in an act of great generosity and trust, and Jesus transforms it into something even greater.

John reminds us that what is happening in this miracle is connected with what would happen during the next Passover: the Last Supper and the death and resurrection of Christ.

John sees it as a symbol of how Jesus seeks to nourish the life he has spoken about. Jesus envisions this food with which he wants to feed us as a banquet he invites us to enjoy. For Jesus, this banquet is a symbol of his desire to share himself with us in the Word of God and in the bread of life. It is, of course, a symbol of the Eucharist.

***** CCD REGISTRATION – K THRU 8 *****

CCD Registration for K thru 8 is **due on August 1st**. After that, families are required to pay a **late fee of \$20**. For your convenience, registration forms are in the back of church and in the Parish office, or **you can download it from our website at stjosephparishnj.org**. First Holy Communion – Children are required to complete 1st grade of Religious Education before they can enter into the 2nd grade of our program for First Holy Communion.

Registration for **new** students will also be taking place. Our program begins with Kindergarten and continues through Grade 8. If you have a child in **Kindergarten only**, the registration fee is \$30. **A copy of their baptismal certificate is required for each new child registered. Families must be registered members of the parish when registering for the program.**

Dear Friends,

About 17 years ago, we began providing for the educational needs of the children of Grand Vincent, Haiti. We began with 400 sponsors (families/individuals) and our school flourished. Today we have 300 registered contributors and recently when we sent an appeal to those sponsors, we got back 48 responses. At present, we have sufficient funds to carry us through November 2018...after that apparently, our door will close.

The road has been long and at times hard, I've been willing to raise the money, make the trips, etc. but with each passing year, it becomes more difficult. Apparently, there is not the support we once had, and I believe that without that support, the only logical step is to terminate our 35 teachers and shut our doors.

Thanking all who have made the journey with me, and praying we've not seen the end, I remain.
