Today we have the meeting of Bartimaeus, the blind beggar that took place on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho. He heard it was Jesus, and called out to Him in his need.

The people around tell him to be quiet. After all, he's only a poor beggar. He should not disturb an important person like Jesus. Bartimaeus will not be put off so easily and continues to call out even more loudly, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Jesus, we should remember, tells us to keep on asking.

The question that Jesus asks Bartimaeus is almost exactly the same as the one we heard him ask James and John last week: "What do you want me to do for you?" but whereas James and John asked for power and glory, not seeing what they were asking of Jesus, Bartimaeus, the blind man, sees Jesus for who he is and asks for healing. Granted his request, Bartimaeus immediately followed Jesus. In other words, he immediately became a disciple. Bartimaeus had been blind, but he had the eyes of faith all along.

My dear friends:

In November, I will make what may very well be my last trip to Grand Vincent in Haiti.

I have addressed the educational needs of about 9,000 children over these 19 years. We now employ 37 teachers in our preschool, elementary and high schools, and of course adult education. We've build a building remodeled the old, and given the community a 300 foot deep water well. By all standards, we have been successful... But the numbers of those committed to helping us financially has diminished... Our last mailing of 300 resulted in 47 positive responses... 47 donations.

As things stand, we will most likely run out of funds mid January... At which time the 37 teachers will be terminated and our school closed.

If you have already met your commitment for this year, I thank you and ask our Lord's blessing upon you... if you have not, won't you please reconsider. I can beg but only you can fill this cup.

I thank you for the love you have shown the children of Haiti, and through them Jesus Christ.
