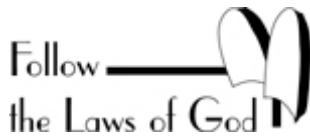

The command to “Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength and with all your mind,” was imprinted on the heart of every Jew, as their central daily prayer. This prayer is the *Shema*, since the Hebrew “*Shema*” means “Listen.” “Listen Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord”. What is special about today’s Gospel is where it says that love of God is completely interwoven with love for each other. Any claim to love God is false if it does not result in loving other people, reaching out to embrace them as God does.

Loving with all of one’s heart is a truly radical challenge, an imitation of Christ. For we believe that life comes from death, that gain comes from loss, that receiving comes from giving, and that Jesus himself had to die to come to the fullness of life. We profess to be followers of one who made a complete offering of himself to the Father and spent his energies and his time in the service of others, who returned to his Father lacking of any earthly goods.

This does not imply that we have to tread exactly the same path as Christ. It means that if we love God, we need to be concerned for others, for the members of our family and community. We need to rise above our selfishness and realize that “*there is greater happiness in giving than in receiving*”.
